Phase 2 of the Downtown Parking Strategy Comes into Effect November 1, 2020

October 14, 2020

This year City Council announced the implementation of a new multi-phased downtown parking strategy. Phase 1 began in May of 2020 with the removal of parking meters and replacing them with free two-hour street parking in our downtown commercial district.

Phase 2 was scheduled to begin October 1, 2020 with the introduction of time-limited lot parking. During the implementation process, stakeholders were asked to provide feedback and City Council received a substantial public response related to phase 2 of the parking strategy. To allow time to review and consider the feedback, implementation of Phase 2 was postponed to November 1, 2020.

Based on the feedback provided, Traffic Bylaw 20-8705 was revised and approved by City Council at their regular meeting held on October 13, 2020. The downtown parking revisions include:

- A third City-owned lot has been added to the Time Limited Parking Lots. Originally, the By-Law included Heritage Square East & West lots. The third lot added is between Howie Avenue and Duke Avenue. For the purposes of the By-Law, the three lots are considered to be one Time Limited Parking Lot.
- Lot parking was initially given the same 2-hour free parking time limit as street parking. This has been changed to 3-hour free parking for lots only. The time limit for free street parking remains at 2 hours.
- The fee for monthly passes has been reduced from \$40 per month to \$25 per month.
- Annual passes will be sold for the cost of eleven months (\$25 per month x 11 months = \$275 for an annual pass).
- An accommodation for approved vendors to sell daily parking passes has been added.
 Now, parking passes can be purchased using the HotSpot Parking app or website, in person at City Hall, and from approved vendors.

Clauses were added to provide free parking for vehicles clearly displaying a Physically
Disabled Person's Parking Permit while parked in a Designated Disabled Parking Space,
and vehicles displaying Veteran license plates while parked in time limited parking
zones.

Phase 2 of the downtown parking strategy will come into effect and electronic enforcement will begin on November 1, 2020.

Monthly and annual parking passes will be available for purchase beginning October 22, 2020 using the HotSpot Parking app or website, or in person at City Hall.
